GOAL, OUTCOME AND OUTPUTS

Goal: Reduction of all forms of GBV and discrimination against women and girls in two provinces of Nepal

Outcome: Local governments, legal authorities, and health facilities provide effective (multi-sectoral) survivor-centered responses to Gender-Based Violence

Outputs:

- Government and non-governmental actors have enhanced capacities for the provision of quality services through temporary shelter homes for survivors
- The health sector has enhanced capacities for the provision of quality services through one-stop crisis management centers, health posts and network of female community health workers
- Local governments have enhanced capacities to provide community-based psychosocial services, which are institutionally linked through the referral pathways
- Informal and quasi-justice systems are strengthened to mediate GBV cases through a gender transformative approach

● PROJECT AREAS

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CORE ACTIVITIES

- Provide technical support to operate new/existing shelter homes (i) aligning with existing guidelines and international standards such as the UN Essential Services Package; (ii) introduce specific standards for the care and protection of survivors under 18 years and for children accompanying survivors; and (iii) introduce procedures for systematic follow up with survivors along the referral pathway to ensure quality of service delivered through the safe/shelter homes
- Identify and support GBV survivors needing life skills (vocational training and other income generating activities/livelihood), linking with other like minded organizations and support the survivors to develop livelihood improvement plan (LIP)
- Support Hospital Management Committee to strengthen the management of OCMCs and ensure quality of service delivered through the OCMCs
- Build the capacity of health workers including FCHV at the health posts and mentor for their role in identification, first-level counseling and referral for delivering quality survivor centered services
- Introduce data management systems and mechanisms for the improved tracking and monitoring of services to maximize the use of data to inform interventions and build capacity of key actors to effectively use the systems in all Shelter homes and OCMCs
- Support local government in hiring the CPSWs and their mobilization at community/ward level
- Provide psychosocial support to GBV survivors, psychosocial counseling, specialized mental health and rehabilitation service, referral, follow up and other services as required - by CPSWs
- Link CPSWs and community facilitators for timely support to GBV survivors and in preventive activities at the community level to increase counseling and referral
- Provide technical assistance to the mediation committees and Judicial committees on Gender transformative and survivor-centered approach focusing on GBV
- Conduct discussions, meetings and policy dialogues with local governments on gender transformative approach and survivor-centered approaches including informal justice system linking with community score card
